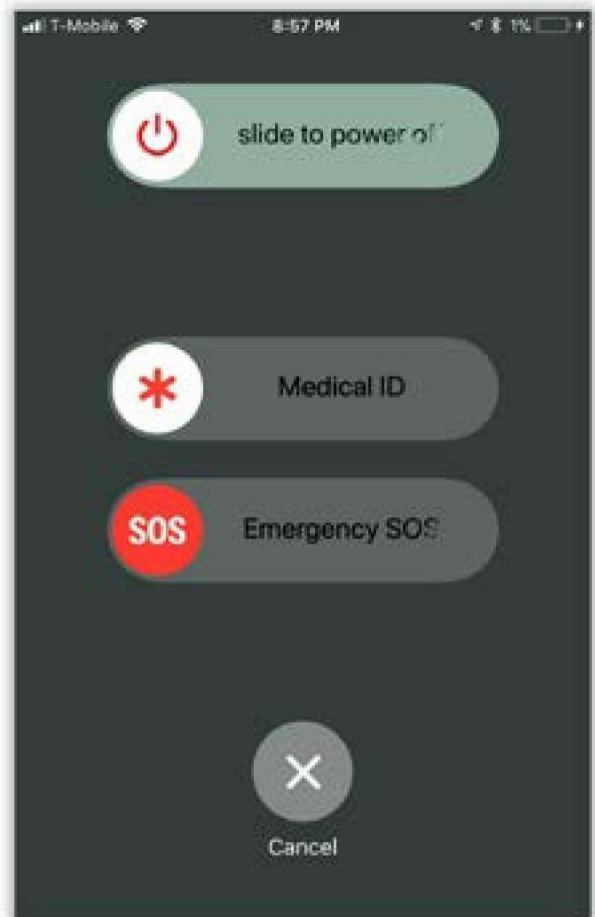
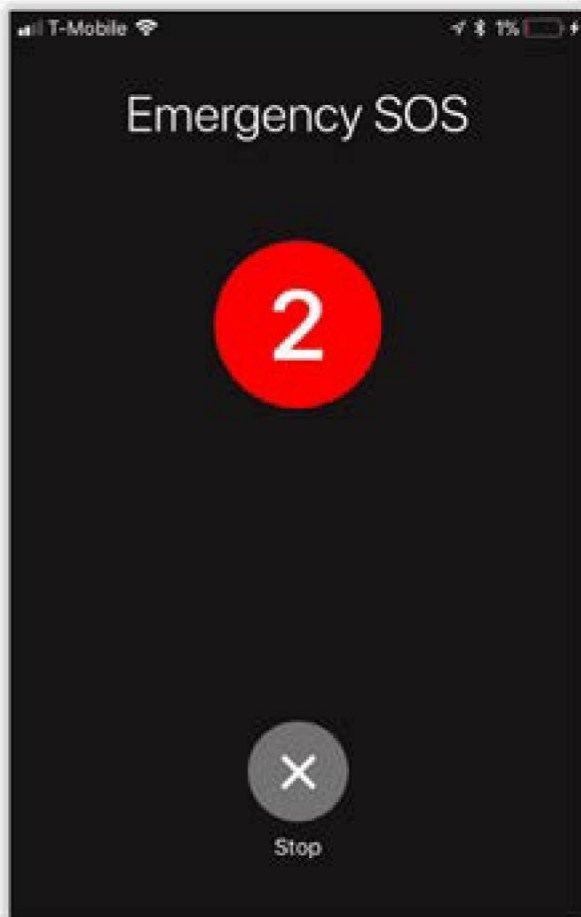


In Case of Emergency

1. In iOS 11, Apple has turned the iPhone into an ingenious, smart emergency beacon. When you're in trouble—you're being followed, you're being attacked, you've fallen, and you can't get up—the phone can automatically dial both 911 and send text messages to specified loved ones, letting them know you have an emergency and including your location. (If you move, they get additional texts letting them know where.)

I tried this, and the OC Sheriff called me.

To set everything up, open the Health App, tap Create Medical ID. Scroll down and add emergency contacts. These are the contacts that are notified. Also, if you hold the side button and volume button at the same time, you'll get a screen with 3 choices – Power Off, Medical ID and Emergency SOS.

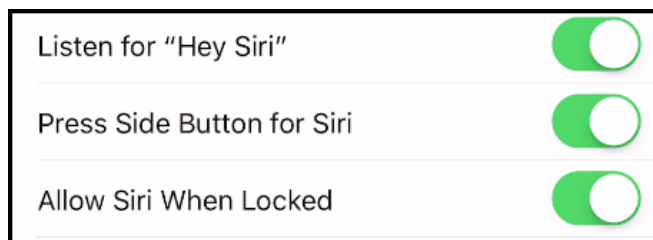


The best thing to do is to have your phone in your pocket or purse when in a strange place with your finger near the side button. Practice this a few times **but be sure to cancel before 3 seconds** has expired unless it's a real emergency..

Now, anyone can pick up your phone, and even if it's locked, they can see your emergency contacts by swiping the Medical ID option.

Important – invoking any of these options will require you or anyone to enter your passcode to access the phone.

2. Create a new Contact with the first name entered as ICE. Scroll down and add names and addresses to be contacted in case of emergency. This helps first responders. But, if anyone who calls you is on this list, they might show up as ICE – so get used to it.
3. Make sure Siri is set up. Go to Settings, Siri & Search and enable the options as shown below.



4. Create a contact under your name. Add any relationships or other entries such as spouse or caregiver (this requires a custom name). Next, open Settings, Contacts and tap My Info. Next, select your name in the address book. Now you can say "Hey Siri call my daughter". If you're in an accident, a first responder can pick up your phone, and without unlocking it, can say "Hey Siri call my wife (or husband).
5. To enable locating your car if you're lost, go to Settings, Maps and enable Show Parked Location. Add this to your Widgets Screen by tapping Edit and scrolling to Maps Destinations. Tap the green plus sign and tap done. Now you can swipe to the right and tap Parked Car to see where you last parked it.
6. Help from the Shutdown Screen
To turn your phone fully off, you're supposed to hold in the side or top button for a few seconds ("Side Button (On/Off)"). But if you hold in the side button and either of the volume buttons simultaneously, you get new additional sliders:
 - Medical ID. Swipe to open a screenful of essential medical information about you. And where does the Medical ID screen get this information? You've filled it out in the Health app ("Health").

- Emergency SOS. This is the same auto-dialing process described already.

Just a note – anytime you use this feature, you will have to use your passcode to unlock the phone.
